
### Why Is It Important

  - Offers Sense of Certainty in Time of Extreme Uncertainty and Grief







# KEY for Surviving Spouses and Spouses Is *Planning!*

- Discussions with Spouse
- Gathering and Reviewing Important Documents
- Making Decisions about Final Arrangements
- Listing Important Contact Information



### **Steps to Prepare**

- Set a Date To Assemble All Important Papers
- Make an Appointment with Spouse/Child/Trusted Friend
- Make Personal Decisions
  - Burial Preferences, Etc.
  - Long Term Care
- Assemble Paperwork (Ensure All Documents Are Current)
  - Social Security Card (Number)
  - . DD 214
  - Veterans' Administration Disability Letter (If Applicable)
  - Service Benefit Plan (If Applicable)
  - Birth/Marriage Certificates
  - Divorce Decrees
  - Property Distributions
  - Bills/Statements
  - Insurance Policies Check Beneficiaries



### **Estate Planning**

- Develop an Estate Plan
  - Periodically Check/Modify as Needed.
  - Consider Including Documents to Spell Out Your Wishes
    - Wills
    - Retired Pay
    - Advanced Care Plans
    - Survivor Benefit Plan (SBP)
    - Life Insurance
    - Burial Plans/Information
    - Continued Benefits
    - Health Care, Dental and Vision Benefits



#### MORE INFORMATION TO PREPARE

- Password/User ID Listing for Online Accounts
- Lock and Safe Combination Listing
- Mortgages, Brokerage Reports, Insurance Policies
  - Check Beneficiaries
- Credit Card and Balance Listing
  - Both Personal and Joint
- Periodic and Occasional Expense Listing
  - Examples: Estimated Taxes, Charitable Gifts, Safety Deposit Box Rentals, Etc.
  - Bank and Credit Card Statements
- Utility Bills (Cable, Internet, Phone, Electric, Gas, Water, Etc.)
  - Ensure Both Names Are On The Account (If Applicable)
- Beneficiaries/Co-Signers on Appropriate Documents
- Other Documents as Needed



### **Document All Information**

- Personal Information About Yourself and Family
- Assets/Liabilities
- Insurance Policies
- Medical Information
- Bills/Statements
- Family/Friend Contact Phones/Addresses
- Final Arrangements
  - · Pre-Planning
  - Civilian vs Military/Federal Cemetery
- Other Information (As Required for Your Situation)



### **Information Storing Options**

- Plastic File Box
- File Cabinet
- Paperwork Binder or Document Book
- Thumb Drive or External USB Hard Drive
- Cloud Based Storage
  - Examples: Dropbox, OneDrive, Google Drive, etc.
- MOAA's Everplans
  - Digital estate planning tool to securely organize/store your vital information

- ID Cards/DEERS
  - Information/Assistance for Family Members to obtain ID cards and enroll in Defense Enrollment Eligibility Reporting System (DEERS)
- TRICARE Information/Referral
  - Medical
  - Dental
  - Vision
  - Eligibility
  - Claims

#### **NEW ID CARDS**

- Everyone <u>Must</u> Have a New Updated ID Card in 2026 (Actual Date is TBD)
- Required Even If Your Current ID Card Says "Indefinite Expiration Date"
  - In 2026, the Legacy Uniformed Services Identification (USID) card will no longer be accepted for access to benefits, privileges, or DoD bases
- Active-Duty Military/Families Take Priority
- Check with Local Military Installations for Requirements and an Appointment
- New ID Cards Have Enhanced Security Features
